



Why use Chat GPT?

 - Welcome emails, weekly recaps, introducing a topic
- Creating robust assignments & rubrics
- Guidance on teaching difficult concepts
- Summarizing News Articles
- Summarizing Student Submissions





What has not worked for me

- Grading
 - GradeScope is a great tool I have yet to use
- MC Question writing
 - If Chat GPT can write it, it can answer it
- Organizing Data
 - It's a LLM, at times it won't get things wrong!
